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SAMPLE INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

1. What inspired you to write *Do You See What I See*?

I wanted to capture the magic of seeing the world through a child's eyes. Children notice things adults often overlook, and their perspective reminds us of the joy and wonder that's always around us.

2. Why focus on grandparents and intergenerational connection?

Grandparents often have a unique patience and sense of curiosity, and their relationships with children are incredibly special. This story celebrates how imagination bridges generations and strengthens family bonds.

3. How did your background in brand storytelling influence your writing?

Storytelling has always been about connecting with people, whether through marketing or literature. I use what I learned in visual storytelling and pacing to make my picture books engaging, layered, and emotionally resonant.

4. How do illustrations contribute to the story?

Illustrations are not just decoration; they create a parallel world. In *Do You See What I See?*, what adults see contrasts with what the child imagines, encouraging readers to slow down and explore multiple perspectives.

5. What do you hope children take away from this book?

I hope children feel empowered to see, imagine, and ask questions. Their creativity is valuable and has the power to inspire adults, too.

6. How can families use this book beyond reading aloud?

Families can use it to spark conversation about perspective, encourage drawing or creative play, and explore the idea that ordinary moments can become extraordinary with a little imagination.

7. What role do picture books play in a child's development?

Picture books nurture literacy, empathy, and curiosity. They give children tools to process emotions, see multiple perspectives, and connect with the world around them.

8. What are your favorite ways to write and develop ideas?

I often draw from family experiences, everyday observations, and playful "what if" scenarios. I also collaborate closely with illustrators to ensure the visuals and story work together to spark wonder.



5 IMPORTANT IDEAS FROM THE BOOK

1. Perspective Shapes Experience

The story shows how adults and children often see the same thing differently. By observing the world through a child's eyes, we learn to notice hidden magic and wonder in everyday life.

2. Imagination Transforms the Ordinary

Everyday objects — sandcastles, bicycles, pool floats, fish — become gateways to adventure, fantasy, and creativity, showing that imagination can make the world more joyful.

3. Intergenerational Connection

Grandparents and grandchildren share experiences that strengthen bonds, encourage play, and create lasting memories across generations.

4. Children Teach Adults

The story emphasizes that children are often our greatest teachers of joy, curiosity, and perspective, reminding adults to pause and see the world with fresh eyes.

5. Mindfulness and Presence

By slowing down and observing details, readers are invited to practice mindfulness, notice subtle beauty, and rediscover the extraordinary in ordinary moments.
